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About us: Social Serve Foundation (SSF) is a benevolent, non-governmental, and registered organization dedicated to the holistic development of marginalized and vulnerable segments of society. We operate without discrimination based on caste, creed, race, gender, religion, or ethnicity. Our work is rooted in grassroots engagement, involving communities that are neglected, oppressed, and excluded. Our initiatives span both rural and urban areas, ensuring that the most at-risk populations—women, children, youth, minorities, persons with disabilities, and economically disadvantaged communities—are empowered through targeted and inclusive development programs. SSF partners with community-based organizations and stakeholders to bring about social transformation through collective action.

Vision: We envision a just and inclusive society built on hope, tolerance, dignity, and social justice, where poverty is eradicated and all individuals live in security and equality.

Mission: To empower underprivileged communities by providing access to quality education, skills training, advocacy, and livelihood support, and by addressing critical social and economic challenges through participatory and sustainable development efforts.

Areas of Intervention:

- **Livelihood Development:** Facilitating sustainable income opportunities through skill training, entrepreneurship, and micro-enterprise support.
- **Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR):** Strengthening community preparedness and resilience through disaster awareness, training, and capacity-building programs.
- **Child Protection & Child Rights:** Ensuring the protection and holistic development of children through education, safety measures, and rights-based advocacy.
- **Women's Rights & Empowerment:** Promoting gender equity, leadership, and empowerment of women through awareness, rights education, and economic independence.
- **Land Rights:** Supporting marginalized communities in accessing and securing rightful land ownership and usage rights.
- **Education:** Promoting inclusive and equitable education for children, youth, and adults, including formal, non-formal, and technical education.
- **Health & Hygiene:** Improving community health outcomes through access to healthcare, awareness on sanitation, nutrition, and clean water initiatives.

Skills Development:

Enhancing employability through vocational training, life skills, digital literacy, and entrepreneurship support.

Blanket Distribution Overview

Helping Needy Elderly Individuals Stay Warm

In Doolahat, Sonapur GP, **20 needy elderly individuals** received blankets this winter. This initiative aims to provide warmth and comfort during the harsh cold months. Our team collaborated with local volunteers to identify those in need and deliver blankets directly to their homes.



The distribution was not just about blankets; it was about **creating connections**. Many elderly individuals expressed their gratitude, sharing stories of their struggles. This initiative highlighted the community's commitment to supporting each other in tough times and emphasized the importance of ongoing support and outreach for vulnerable populations.



Awareness on Government Schemes

Key Highlights of Our Initiatives

In Doolahat, **20 needy elderly individuals** received blankets this winter. Additionally, an awareness program educated over 250 villagers about essential government schemes, including PMJAY, pensions, and MGNREGA, ensuring they are informed about available resources to improve their quality of life.

A community meeting in Papum Pare introduced **local youth and women** to government-supported skill development programs. Likewise, a training program in makeup artistry empowered 25 women through a 35-day course. SSF is committed to fostering growth and skill acquisition for underserved community members, enhancing their opportunities for success.





Skill Development Awareness

Engaging Youth and Women in Papum Pare

A community meeting was organized to **introduce local youth and women** to government-supported skill development programs. This initiative aimed to empower participants with knowledge and resources necessary for enhancing their employability and promoting entrepreneurship within the community.

The response was overwhelmingly positive, as over 50 individuals attended the meeting and they are encouraged to inform others. Many expressed interest in pursuing training opportunities that would help them develop skills in various sectors. By fostering such community engagement, we aim to create lasting change and improve livelihoods in Papum Pare.



Food Processing Training

A 35-day practical training on food processing was conducted for 25 individuals supported by the Indian Institute of Entrepreneurship (IIE). Participants learned value addition techniques on local food products such as pickles, jams, papads, biscuits, cake and juices. Topics included hygiene, basic machinery, labeling, pricing, and marketing. Trainers also discussed entrepreneurship pathways, including SHG-based production and local sales channels. At the end of the training, certificates were provided. Follow-up support was assured for those interested in setting up units.

Outcomes:

- 25 individuals trained in food processing.
- 6 participants formed a working group to start a micro-enterprise.
- Improved knowledge on hygiene and small business skills.
- Enhanced self-employment potential, especially for women.

Training on Makeup Artist

A skill development training on makeup artistry was organized for 25 young women from marginalized backgrounds. The 35-day course included hands-on training in bridal makeup, party makeup, skin care, and client communication. Participants were encouraged to start home-based services or join beauty parlors.

Outcome:

- 25 participants successfully trained
- Enhanced self-employment opportunities for women
- Follow-up session planned for business setup support

Coordination Meeting for Mega Health Camp with Health Department

SSF presented a coordination meeting with the District Health Department to plan an upcoming Mega Health Camp. Key discussion points included location selection, deployment of doctors and nurses, required medical equipment, and awareness campaigns for community mobilization.

Outcome:

- Action plan drafted for Mega Health Camp
- Tentative schedule finalized
- Health Department agreed to provide logistical and medical support
